CASE STUDY

Hugo Matthias

I completed my 2023 Work placement at NT Cricket. The purpose of this placement was to assist NT Cricket and gain experience in a workplace. I worked as a grounds staff member with the head curator and an apprentice. The job involved taking care of the cricket grounds at Marrara. I was assigned the job of rolling the pitch, setting out the boundary ropes and helping with the placement of advertisement boards. I was also responsible for cleaning the venue. NT Cricket were relatively short staffed, meaning when I came in every Friday I could be extra support which was useful as it's a large venue.

As a whole, it was a positive experience for me, as I am very passionate about cricket. Therefore, being involved with the peak sporting body made me feel happy with myself. The extra assistance I was able to give as well as having a cricket player on board meant I was able to give feedback on things such as match scheduling and performance of grounds. I have developed my own independence, I would have to wake up early and ensure I was on time. I also developed time management in regard to working on multiple tasks at once, this has enhanced my professionalism in the workplace. A highlight was when we dropped the cricket pitch into TIO Stadium. This was special because no cricket had been played at that ground for 16 years and I felt proud because I was involved in bringing cricket back to TIO Stadium.

I believe working with NT Cricket gave me an insight to what I want for my future. After working with them this year, I can comfortably say that I would work with NT Cricket or any cricket organisation in the future.



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
