CASE STUDY

Katelyn James

My involvement with Netball SA started through SEDA in 2022. I began a placement organising weekly NetSetGo sessions and doing the admin, including selecting age-appropriate drills from resources, printing name tags, making registrations available every term, and assisting the coach each session. This gave me first-hand coaching experience, and an awareness of the unexpected admin.

My role on placement supported Netball SA as I was able to help them by taking on responsibilities. I enjoyed seeing firsthand what a role at Netball SA would look like and what is really involved in being a coach. Before placement, I was only coaching one team as a volunteer, but I quickly fell in love with it. Lucy and Hanna, who were Netball SA employees at the time, took me under their wing and pushed me to put myself out there. After lots of discussion with staff at Netball SA I was able to organise an interview to become a Community Coach. My time at Netball SA led to coaching more teams of my own and building a network with schools and clubs. I was successful with this role; this changed my life. I was able to resign from my casual job and do something I loved and be paid for it! This is everyone's dream.

In my role as a community coach, I was able to support Netball SA by taking on a lot of coaching this year to ensure that they always had a keen coach ready to work. Skills and attributes that I learnt throughout both experiences is motivation, communication, responsibility, and organisation. For example, taking on coaching that was sometimes during school required a lot of communication with my teacher and manager. Both experiences have helped me create a future career path and coaching is definitely something I would like to continue.

"Being involved with the SEDA netball program has been a great opportunity to share common interests in sport and help students develop their skills. Through this partnership I have had the opportunity to do guest speaking appearances, run fitness testing and other events, whilst getting to know and work with the students. The SEDA students have been a great addition to the Netball SA and Thunderbirds family, helping run clinics and volunteering on game days to help us share netball with the many members and participants. I see this partnership as a positive to both Netball SA and SEDA, connecting real life experiences from the top level of sport to the classroom."
